Womens Foil Individual

09.30 Registration, 10.00 start – 1 poule round

13.00 Registration, 13.30 start – 1 poule round
15.00 start DE

09.00 Registration, 09.30 start – 1 poule round

Regulations:

For the Mens Epee competition official rules for FIE Satellite and Coupe du Nord tournaments apply. For the rest of the Championships FIE rules with Irish modifications apply (i.e. no elimination from 1st round poule)

Formula:

Mens Epee Competition – Coupe du Nord

One pre-tournament round of poules with seeding given with priority to 1) fencers with FIE points, 2) fencers with Coupe du Nord points, 3) other fencers. All fencers entered must compete and no elimination from this round. One round of poules in “tournament proper”. Seeding based on indicators from the pre-tournament round. 20-30% of fencers eliminated after this round. Seeding for direct elimination is based on indicators from round 2 only. Direct elimination will take place, without repechage, to the final four.

Other Competitions (Mens Foil/Sabre, Womens Foil/Epee/Sabre)

One round of poules without elimination. Seeding for DE based on 1st round poule. Depending on entries, this formula may be varied.

Weapon Control Mens Epee event:

Friday night 2nd Dec: 18.00 – 21.00; Saturday morning 3rd Dec: 08.00 – 09.15

Fencers are encouraged to have weapons checked on Friday night in order to avoid delay on Saturday. Masks and weapons will be checked

Equipment: Mens Epee event:

FIE 800 newton jackets, breeches and plastrons must be worn – masks 1600 newton. FIE blades obligatory. Country colours on breeches.

Licences:

FIE licences obligatory for Mens Epee event – entry on FIE website by National Federations. IFF or National Federation licences required for other events

Referees, Mens Epee event:

As per FIE rules

Doping Control:

Doping Control will take place in the Mens Epee event, and may also take place at other events.

Entry Fees:

One weapon	€20
Two weapons	€25
Three weapons	€30

Entries:

Entries for Mens Epee satellite competition are to be made by National Federations via the FIE website, at the latest 8 days beforehand (**before** 27 November, i.e. no later than 26 November) according to FIE rules.
